GPAP brings together key players across multiple sectors to take collaborative action on tackling plastic pollution in developing countries. The UK has committed £20.5 million globally to its support. GPAP acts by:

- Building dialogue and cooperation platforms called NPAPs.
- Generating knowledge based in evidence and inclusive roadmaps.
- Catalysing and implements strategic actions.
- Paving the way for a future global plastics treaty.
